

    - Tornadoes




#### What is OH WARN?

    - Water/Wastewater System Expertise




## Why OH WARN is needed

Because things will happen...











#### OH WARN in Action

- "Hurricanes don't hit Ohio."
- ➤ Hurricane Ike 9/14/08
- Cincinnati, Columbus and Dayton metro areas were all strongly impacted
  - Widespread power outages
  - >1 Million Residents affected
  - Roads and highways blocked
  - Likely to last > 1 week



#### Hurricane Ike



- City of Fairborn
  - Population 33,000
  - Initially lost power
  - Power restored w/in 6 hours
- City of Hamilton
  - Population 60,000
  - Sustained power outage
  - Local contacts proved fruitless
  - Turned to OH WARN
  - City of Fairborn responds
    - Portable generator
    - 4 Days
    - 350 Residents



#### > Results


- Increased communication and networking between OH WARN members


