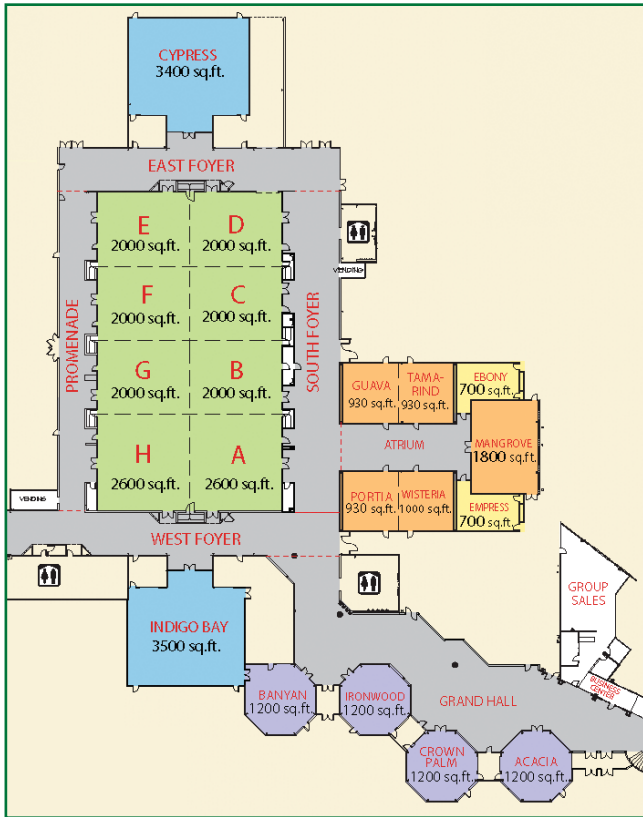

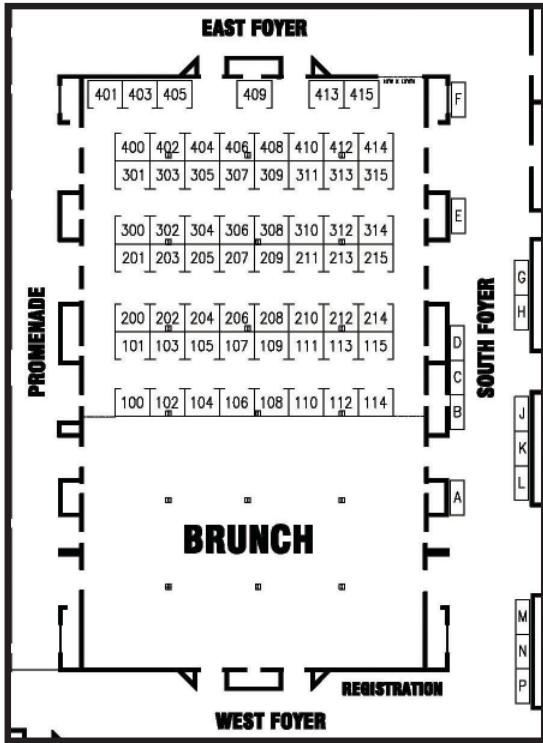


Exhibit Expo Floor Plan

Adopted June 17, 1964, Cincinnati, Ohio

- 6. To refrain from offering reduced fees knowingly, for services being performed by another competent person in this field.
- 7. To place service before gain, being truthful in all endeavors, and in humility with the need for divine guidance I make this pledge.
